Walhalla, SC—Captain Henry Douglas (Hank) Flood, USMC (RET), 78, of Walhalla, SC, died Thursday, March 11, 2010, at his residence.

A native of Camp Taylor, KY, Mr. Flood was the son of the late Kenneth S. and Dorothy Louise Morris Flood. He was a member of both St. Francis Catholic Church and St. Paul Catholic the Apostle Church. He was retired from the USMC, having served in both the Korean and Vietnam Wars, earning a Purple Heart during the Korean conflict. Mr. Flood was also retired from Clemson University as a victim's advocate He had worked at Oconee Nuclear Station as Southern Security Training Lieutenant. Mr. Flood was a lifetime member of the American Legion Post # 124; lifetime member of the Marine Corps League; lifetime member of the NRA; and lifetime member of North American Hunting Club. He was a 4th degree Knights of Columbus; past president of St. Francis Catholic Church Council; Catechist for Children's Religious Education at St. Francis Catholic Church; member of the Marine Corps Mustang Association; and champion of handball, volleyball, badminton and racquet ball. He was also an avid runner.
