



Mr. "Dick" Edmund Richard Heebner

December 25, 1917 - January 4, 2013

"Dick" Edmund Richard Heebner, 95, twice married, first to the late Shirley Mae Gaylord Heebner, and second to the late Shirley Weaving Heebner, died Friday, January 4, 2013 at Clemson Downs.

A native of Waterbury, CT, Mr. Heebner was the son of Carl F. and Elsie Chase Heebner. He was a Mechanical Engineer for Sanford & Sons. He was a veteran of the Army Air Corps and served in WWII. He was a member of United Church of Christ in Southbury, CT. Dick was very active his whole life in community and civic organizations. A few examples are VFW, Lions Club, The American Legion, Board of Education, and Justice of the Peace.

Mr. Heebner is survived by a son, Richard Gaylord Heebner of Waterbury, CT; daughter, Judy Mordhorst of Salem, SC, and Holly Taylor of Middletown, CT; step-daughter, Barbara Lines of St. Helens, OR; brother, Charles Heebner of Watertown, CT; sister, Nancie Pidge-Moore of Coatsville, PA; seven grandchildren and four great-grandchildren.

In addition to his wife and parents, Mr. Heebner was predeceased by sisters, Shirley Beardsley and Doris Rauch.
