



Rev. Donald Calvin King

May 30, 1968 - May 20, 2025

Donald Calvin King, a man whose life was a testament to his unwavering faith and deep love for others, passed away on May 20, 2025, at Lexington Medical Center, Lexington, SC. He was 56 years old. After a courageous six-year battle with cancer, he has now entered his eternal home.

Born and raised in Seneca, SC, Donald was the cherished son of the late Rev. Warren Calvin and Lillian Kate Treadaway King. The love of his family enriched his life, and he leaves behind his beloved wife of twenty-eight years, Robin Carol Eskew King, and their three children, who were his blessings from God: Andrew Donald King, Caleb Robert King, and Katelyn Elizabeth King, all of Lexington, SC. He is also survived by his loving sister, Michelle King McLane (Scott) of Seneca, SC, and his nephews, Hunter McLane and Landon McLane (Madison). Donald was predeceased by his parents and his stepmother, Abigail Davis King.

Donald's calling to the ministry was a profound part of his life's journey. Licensed and ordained as a Southern Baptist minister by Return Baptist Church, Seneca, SC, he dedicated himself to serving God and the church for thirty-nine years. His ministry touched countless lives through his roles at Reedy Fork Baptist Church, Seneca, SC; Scenic Height Baptist Church, West Union, SC; McCall Royal Ambassador Camp, Sunset, SC; First Baptist Church Warrior, AL; Double Springs Baptist Church, Taylors, SC; Calvary

Baptist Church, Florence, SC; the North American Mission Board, Alpharetta, GA; Morningside Baptist Church, Columbus, GA; and finally, the South Carolina Baptist Convention, Columbia, SC, where he served as the Director of Leadership Development.

A lifelong learner, Donald graduated from Seneca High School, attended North Greenville College, and graduated from Samford University. He furthered his theological studies obtaining his Masters at New Orleans Baptist Theological Seminary, and where he most recently pursued a doctoral degree.

More than his titles and accomplishments, Donald will be remembered for his genuine desire to see others grow in their faith and understanding of Jesus Christ. He lived by the words of Ephesians 4:11-13, striving to equip others for service and building up the body of Christ.

A service celebrating Donald's life will be held at 12pm on Saturday, May 24th at Hepsibah Baptist Church, Seneca, SC. Reverends Jerry Sosebee, Keith Harrill, and Bryant Sims will officiate, with music by Rev. Scott McClellan and Mrs. Bernice Satterfield. The family will receive friends immediately following the service. A private interment with family will be held at Oconee Memorial Park in Seneca, SC.

In lieu of flowers, the family kindly requests that memorials be made to the Donald & Robin King Endowment through the South Carolina Baptist Foundation.
