



## Mr. Francis Marion Eubanks Jr

January 21, 1944 - September 29, 2014

Francis Marion Eubanks, Jr. passed away peacefully, at home and surrounded by friends and family, on September 29th following a long illness. He is survived by his wife Carol, daughters: Charlotte Eubanks and April Parmley, daughter-in-law: Etta Habegger, son-in-law: Bob Parmley, Jr., grandchildren: Callie Parmley, John Parmley and Maren Eubanks, and sister: Bettye Armour. He was predeceased by his son, John Walter Eubanks, in 1995.

Francis was born in Washington, Georgia, to Belle Glaze Eubanks and Francis Marion Eubanks, Sr. on January 21, 1944. He graduated Washington-Wilkes High School in 1962, after performing as a starting player on the 1961 AAA State Championship football team.

He completed a Bachelor's Degree in Civil Engineering at Georgia Tech in 1967, and a Master of Science in Civil Engineering at Georgia Tech in 1969. An engineer all his life, he worked for firms in Georgia, Tennessee and Florida before joining Clemson University as a Professor of Construction Science Management in 1985. He was honored by admission to the Royal Chartered Institute of Building in 2000.

An avid fisherman, active church member, and generous community member, he will be greatly missed.

A celebration of his life will be held at Salem United Methodist Church (520 Church St, Salem) on Tuesday, October 7 at 2:00 PM.
