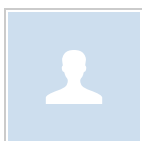

“ *Janice, I am so sorry for the loss of your wonderful Aunt and friend. She will always be warmly remembered for the great lady she was. I miss her too.*

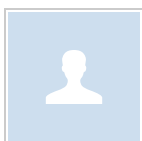
