



Mr. Irvin White Smith

June 2, 1937 - January 14, 2021

Irvin “Smitty” “Spidey” White Smith, 83, husband of Barbara Watrous Smith, of Seneca, passed away Thursday, January 14, 2021, at Oconee Memorial Hospital.

A native of Framingham, MA, Mr. Smith was the son of the late Julia Larrabee and Chester Irvin Smith and brother of the late Bernard Smith. He graduated from Framingham High School in 1955, and received his accounting degree from Bentley College. He was a veteran of the United States Naval Reserve. He was the Director of Accounting of Northrop Grummon Corporation until he retired in 1992.

Irv was a long-time member of Grace Family Church, and also was attending Foot Hills Church.

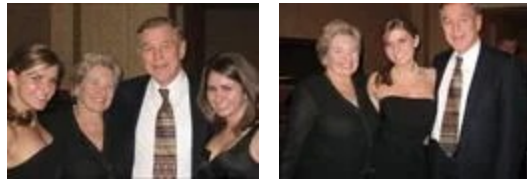
