James Cozier, 76, of Salem, beloved husband of Patricia Cozier, passed away peacefully at his home on Wednesday, April 16, 2025.

Born in New York, NY, Mr. Cozier was the son of the late Allan Dudley and Jane Cussen Cozier. A proud veteran, he served as a Naval Officer in the United States Navy, completing a tour of duty in Vietnam as a naval advisor and serving aboard the USS Knox. His dedication to service continued throughout his life as a member of the Walhalla American Legion Post 124 Honor Guard, the Coast Guard Auxiliary, and Rescue 22. Mr. Cozier earned his undergraduate degree from the College of Santa Fe in New Mexico, where he was a member of the TKE fraternity. He went on to build a long and successful career as a plant manager in the canning manufacturing industry, traveling extensively and making a lasting impact over 45 years before his retirement. He will be remembered for his deep sense of duty and love for his family.

In addition to his wife, Mr. Cozier is survived by his sons: Andrew Radcliffe Cozier, James Radcliffe Cozier, and Robert Radcliffe Cozier; brothers: Robert Cozier (Theresa), and Kevin Cozier (Dorothy); sister: Susan Harnett; and grandchildren: Bridget, Emily, Owen, and Neil.

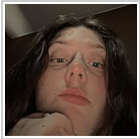
