Joseph Neal Taylor, 82, of 240 Old Flat Shoals Road, Walhalla, SC, husband of the late Joyce Smith Taylor, died Wednesday, December 26, 2012 at Cottingham Hospice House.

A native of Oconee County, Mr. Taylor was the son of the late Robert L. and Alice Corneilla Neal Taylor. He retired from Sangamo and was a veteran on the US Army.
