Judith Mae Cowman, 81, wife of Robert Charles Cowman, of Salem, passed away on Sunday, October 20, 2024, at her home.

A native of Davenport, Iowa, Mrs. Cowman was the daughter of the late Richard and Violenza Marie (Bertozzi) Neumann. Judith served as a teacher, coach, athletic director and assistant principal in Southeastern Wisconsin for over 30 years before retiring to South Carolina. As well as being a member of the Wisconsin Athletic Association, "Judy" was active in sports her entire life. Besides spending many years coaching volleyball and pom poms (she loved to dance), she was a fixture in the women's softball, basketball, tennis and soccer scenes in Kenosha, WI. Later in life, Judy loved to golf and play tennis. She was a Zumba instructor and a member of the Keowee Key Community. If there was dancing, Judy was in the middle of the dance floor leading the charge.

In addition to her husband, Mrs. Cowman is survived by her son: Troy Bowe (Jennifer) of Wisconsin; daughter: Kelly Ann Cowman of Michigan; brother: Dave Neumann (Teresa) of Oregon; and grandchildren: Garrison Bryant, Camille Bowe and Ella Cowman.

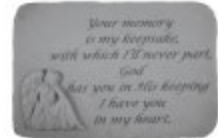
