Mary MacIntyre Smith, 82, of Salem, passed away on Wednesday, November 2, 2022, at her residence.

Mary was born in Burlington, Vermont to Norman and Viola MacIntyre and raised in Whitinsville, Massachusetts. She graduated from Northbridge High School and then attended Worcester City Hospital School of Nursing and became a registered nurse. During this time, Mary met the love of her life, Charles D. Smith, whom she married and shortly thereafter relocated to South Carolina. She was a resident of Keowee Key for the last twelve years after living in Georgia since 1983 and previously in South Carolina since 1961.

Mary was married to her beloved husband, Charles, for thirty-six years until his sudden death in 1998. She leaves behind three children, her daughter: Robin Pahr (Patrick); her sons: Dan Smith and Craig Smith (Lisa); and four grandchildren: Austin Pahr, Christopher Pahr, Charlie Marie Smith, and Duncan Smith. She also leaves behind a special person, Marian Buma of Whitinsville, MA, who remained her best friend since early childhood.

In addition to her husband and parents, Mary was preceded in death by her sister: Marilyn Cram; and brothers: Norman and Richard MacIntyre.

Mary enjoyed cooking, crafts, sewing, and loved traveling with her family. She

was a happy person, loved life, and made an impact on all the people around her.

ago. I am so grateful for that. Both times you said, "We don't say goodbye. We say until we meet again in this life or in heaven." I am in shock that you are no longer here. I miss your morning group emails and the personal ones. I deeply miss your phone calls. You called so often and that is what I needed. Connecting with you made the day all the better.

When we spoke two days before your heaven-going, I shared this with you, "This world is not my home; I'm just a passing through; my treasures are laid up somewhere beyond the blue; the angels beckon me from heavens open door, and I won't feel at home in this world anymore." You said you really loved that and I am comforted in knowing you are in heaven now, safe in the arms of Jesus. I can hear your voice telling me not to worry, to love those around us, and to keep moving on, just as you did.

I am so thankful for every minute we spent together and especially the last time we saw each other and the last phone call when we shared "I love you(s)" as we often did.
