Salem, SC – Philip Anthony Pfeifer, 86, husband of Claudette Lucille Couillard Pfeifer, of Salem, SC, passed away peacefully Sunday, June 29, 2014 at Oconee Medical Center surrounded by his children, several grandchildren, and his beloved wife. Philip's friends, Fr. Bernard Okokon of St. Paul the Apostle Catholic Church and Fr. Emmanuel Andinam, blessed his passage to his Heavenly Father.

Philip was born on April 4, 1928 in Detroit, Michigan, where many family members and friends treasure his memory. Philip graduated from St. Joseph High School, University of Detroit, and served our country as a Sergeant Major in the U.S. Army during the Korean Conflict. Philip worked in various capacities for the Chrysler Corporation in Detroit, Michigan, New Castle, Indiana, and Dayton, Ohio. He retired as a Division Controller.

Philip was a man of deep and abiding faith in his Church and his God. Wherever he lived, Philip was an active and vital member of his Catholic Parish.
