He is survived by his wife, Marsha of Seneca, his children Ryan Goff (Stacie) of Saluda, Lindsey Hughes (Dustin) of Greenville and Casey Winn (Justin) of Saluda and 7 grandchildren, Kaden Hughes, Ryton Goff, Cooper Hughes, Palmer Hughes, Jordan Winn, Jacob Winn and Liv Hughes who lovingly called him Hacman. He is also survived by his sisters Jackie Sprawls and Janice Hipp.

He was preceded in death by his father and mother, Ray and Virginia Goff.

Hascal was fully loyal and dedicated to the people and things he loved. First and foremost, he loved Jesus. He had a quiet and steady faith that provided strength and stability for the rest of the family. Hascal faithfully served the Lord in his local church, as a member of Saluda Baptist Church for over 45 years and a member of NewSpring Church for over 12 years. He enjoyed serving in several capacities, including being a part of the production team and cooking and serving meals to hungry Clemson students at NewSpring!

Hascal loved his family! He was married to his wife, Marsha, for 49 years. He adored her from the time they started dating as teenagers. He served her

He is so proud of them and without a doubt one of his greatest joys was spending time with his wife, children and their spouses, and his 7 wonderful and “lively” grandchildren.

Clemson was his other love. He served as an IPTAY rep for many years. His “happy place” was sitting anywhere watching the Tigers play. He was thrilled to spend the last few years of his life in Clemson where the Blue Ridge “yawns its greatness”

Hascal loved Barbeque. He could tell you all the best hole in the wall BBQ joints all over the state of SC. He had a love for good food, and enjoyed the memories and fellowship that occur around a dinner table. It was a wonderful adventure for him to start and launch the “HacSauce” BBQ sauce brand with his son Ryan for the last few years.

He started his collegiate career at Clemson and finished college with a Bachelors degree from Limestone college. He worked as a Chemistry Supervisor at the VC Summer Nuclear Station in Jenkinsville, SC for 43 years, retiring in 2018.

“Hascal. He and I were first (1st) cousins. He was about 18 years older. Due to that age gap, we did not have much interaction between us. Most interactions centered around family functions and, as one may have guessed, Clemson athletics.

One of the more memorable “Clemson events” occurred in October 1985. I went with Hascal, his two oldest children, and one of their child cousins to the UVA-Clemson game.

On the way up to that game, Hascal treated us to a breakfast at Shoney’s in Anderson. While in Anderson, he showed me where the football team stayed before a home game, and he subsequently answered my question as to why the football team lodged off campus before a home game.

We all sat in his favorite section of Death Valley – Section UT. We had an enjoyable time watching Clemson win. During the game, Hascal educated me on the game of football by:

- explaining how penalties were enforced,
- the difference between the game clock and the play clock, and
- why/when the game clock stops or continues to run.

Afterwards, we toured Bowman Field with all the Homecoming floats. What fun that was!

Once I got into my sophomore and junior years at Clemson (which were the 1992 and 1993 football seasons), it was not uncommon for me to see Hascal and his family from my dorm window (Cope Hall) watching the band march down the hill toward the stadium. We crossed paths a few times during my collegiate years.

The last time I recall seeing one another at a Clemson event was at the Boston airport (BC game). He and Marsha saw dad, Jerry R., and I at the Delta gate. Marsha actually saw us first and said “hi.” Oh, Hascal was a “Clemsonite.”

Outside of Clemson-related activities, most of our interactions were at the family-wide Christmas Eve get-togethers (which last occurred in 2013, which ended 74 consecutive years of this event), the 4th of July BBQ on Lake Murray (Aunt Lois's place), other family cook-outs over the years, helping his father with the cattle now and then (I do not miss that and neither does Ryan), and even in passing by each other early in the mornings on the Denny Hwy as he was going to VC Summer and I was going to Saluda High School. I seem to recall he drove a Mercury Cougar for the longest time.

I did swing by his second house a time or two to visit. And there were likely a few other times we crossed paths, too. I simply cannot recall all of them at this moment. The last time I saw him was in January 2023 for his mother's service (my Aunt Virginia). It was at that occasion that I first saw how much he favored his father (my Uncle Ray). I wanted to pay him a visit this summer, but...

I know he was a very committed church-going man. I cannot ever recall hearing him use profanity. I even met up with him at Saluda Baptist when the Saluda High FCA was conducting church visits back in the day. He was a devoted Christian man!

Oh, I almost forgot. I did visit Hascal when he was in the hospital in Augusta, GA, for back surgery. I was working at SRS at the time. So, it made sense to swing by. Once he was discharged, my family sent him some pulled BBQ pork from Matthews BBQ (in Saluda). He wrote us a thank you note for the BBQ and my visit.

He later started his own brand of BBQ sauce – HacSauce. My family purchased several bottles. Oh, the descendants of Fred Goff and Pauline Ruff Goff are into BBQing!!!

In closing, I have mixed feelings as I write. I am sad to lose his physical presence. Yet, I (and the rest of the family) can take solace in the fact that he is no longer suffering from that dreaded respiratory complication that plagued him for the last few years of his life.

Rest in peace, cousin! When my "number is called," I expect to see you at those pearly gates all decked out in orange, white, and purple with some BBQ and HacSauce to greet me!
