Ray Martin Cain, 88, of Seneca, SC, died Wednesday, June 6, 2012 at Cottingham Hospice House of Seneca. He was the husband of Margaret Hembree Cain, and a native of Oconee County, born in Oakway, SC.

Mr. Cain was the son of the late Claude "Doc" Burriss and Neta Martin Cain. He attended textile classes at Clemson University and taught textiles two years at Westminster High School. He served in the United States Navy during World War II as an airplane mechanic. He was a member of the "ccc".

Mr. Cain retired as Vice-President of Minette Mills, Grover, NC. He was responsible for the start-up of textile manufacturing facilities in Canada, Philippines, and Guatemala.

He was a member of Bountyland Baptist Church, Seneca American Legion, Woodmen of the World, and Legendary Mason of the year of Seneca Masonic Lodge serving over sixty years.
