



## Mrs. Roberta Head

January 30, 1933 - December 20, 2016

Minnie Roberta Morgan Head, 83, wife of Harold B. Head of Redland Ranch Road, Walhalla, daughter of James Robert and Bertha Evans Morgan, and descendant of early settlers of Oconee and Pickens counties, died peacefully December 20, 2016, at the Cottingham Hospice House in Seneca, after an extended illness. She lived in the Clemson/Central/Pendleton area until moving to Abbeville, SC, Washington, GA, and finally the Walhalla/Seneca area in 1964.

Born January 30, 1933, on her grandfather's farm in Pickens, SC. She graduated from Calhoun-Clemson High School, and attended Central Wesleyan College. Married in 1951 to Harold Benard Head, they celebrated their 65th wedding anniversary in April of 2016. She was a devout Christian of Methodist faith and member of Lawrence Chapel in Central, SC; co-founder of Head-Lee Nursery, Inc., a talented artist, crafter, seamstress, florist and horticulturist. Many employee career paths lead them to the nursery where she shared not only her knowledge and wisdom, but also loved them as if they were her own children. She semi-retired in 1988, but remained an active advisor of the company until her recent passing.
