“ I am really saddened to hear of Rosa's passing. She was somewhere between a special friend and a grandmother to me. I've known her since 1992, when my first wife and I moved into a trailer next to her. My wife and I got to know her, and she gave us a jump after we had loaded our car going back to Florida and our battery died. My wife didn't see her after that and passed away 3 years later. I did continue to see Rosa when I worked up there, and continued to see her until about a year ago. She met my second wife, my Mom, and my granddaughter. I usually saw her 2 to 4 times a year, and also went to church with her some. We usually talked about the good old days. She would usually mention my first wife and how she thought she was special, which meant a lot to me. She would always ask about my Mom too. She was pretty tough. A little like Kate Hepburn in True Grit. The last time I visited Rosa (early 2007), I cut a little firewood for her, which was probably the first time she let me do it. After I got started, she met me outside with another axe and started chopping some herself. She loved to fish, which was a love we shared.
