Terry "TC" Craig Garrett, 62, of 1833 Sequoya Way, Seneca, SC died Saturday, February 9, 2013 at his residence.

A native of Oconee County, Mr. Garrett was the son of the late J. F. "Jake" and Lorena Adams Garrett. He was a Training Instructor at Duke Power, and was a Vietnam veteran that proudly served in the U.S. Navy.

Mr. Garrett, a loving and dedicated father, is survived by sons, Chad Garrett and Jason Garrett, both of Charleston SC; brother, Mike Garrett (Debbie) of Westminster; and a sister Carolyn Woody (David) of Walhalla.

“ I met TC a little over two years ago. He quickly became a permanent fixture in our weekly routine. He came by at least once a week like clockwork. Some weeks he would come by two, three, or four times especially if he had news to share or needed to talk. Most people in his life knew him a lot longer than I have, but I got to know him the last couple of years of his life. I had the honor of hearing him reflect on the years of his life and what it all meant to him. TC was your All-American Man. He loved God. He shared many prayers and scripture with me and my boys. He brought and showed me where he had written out the Beatitudes for his sons and how often he pulled it out through the years. He shared his faith and that he felt that God had blessed his life daily. TC also loved his mama. He talked frequently about her. He loved her, respected her, and missed her. I know he is rejoicing with her now. He loved his sister and brother too! Many nights when he came to visit us it was after he had been to visit “sis”. As most All-American Men, TC also loved his country and those who served and continue to serve. TC was a very proud Vietnam Vet. He was proud of his country and grateful to all the men and women who have served and continue to serve our country. He wore his hat with his medals on it, and if asked he would share his story when he was ready. I will always remember to thank veterans after hearing TC’s stories about how much it meant to him. Many evenings when he seemed a little blue he would chat about his time over there. It still haunted him. He taught me that it doesn’t matter if it has been 6 weeks, 6 months, 6 years, or 40 years when soldiers come home from war, the war comes home with them. Our vets and our soldiers need our support, our prayers, and our gratitude and that is one way we can all honor TC’s memory. TC loved Duke Power and most of the people there. He loved the friendships he had made there through the years. He came over heartbroken many times as someone from work had passed or as a co-worker lost a child. He would also come over to brag if a new grandchild was born to a co-worker. He was a tenderhearted person when it came to others. When it came time to decide about retirement, he had to make a decision. He would come over and chat after talking with his sister and ask us our opinion. I

think he was torn. It was a bittersweet decision for him. He was relieved every time they gave him an extension on his retirement date. Yet when it came at last, he was emotional about it. He would come over and tell us how many days were left until it was official. He came over and showed us his 40 years of service plaque. He was so proud.

*And last but not least TC loved his boys Chad and Jason. I have never met them in person, but I feel as if I know them, at least through TC's eyes. He was so proud of the men they have become. He would make special trips over to our house after talking with one of his "boys" just to brag. TC shared stories of raising his boys from when they were young boys, teenagers, and young men. His boys meant the world to him. He loved them both so much. He told me no matter how old they were he would always be there for them and give them what he could. He would bring pictures over that Chad had taken or drawn through the years to share. He would come over and tell us how proud he was of Jason when he was taking more classes for work or tell us about some of rescues. He always told me that he did the best he could by them and you could see and hear the love he had for his boys. Exactly a year ago, for Valentine's Day TC brought me a Willow Tree figurine that symbolized kindness and he told me, "Thank you for welcoming a lonely, old man into your home and listening to him ramble." This Valentine's Day I want to say to TC- Thank you for the friendship over the last two years. You were one of a kind who quickly became a part of our lives. Your weekly visits will missed by all of us! We love you!
