



Mr. Towns C. Ramey

March 4, 1930 - November 18, 2012

Towns C. Ramey, 82, husband of the late Betty Adair Ramey, of 515 West Quincy Road, Seneca, South Carolina, died Sunday, November 18, 2012 at Oconee Medical Center.

He began employment with South Carolina National Bank in Greenville, SC in 1949. He was transferred to the Seneca office of the bank as Assistant Manager, Officer in charge of Consumer Credit and Secretary of the Bank's Advisory Board in April, 1963.

He Immediately joined Seneca Rotary Club, April 1963; served on various committees in Rotary, including Board of Directors; elected president of Seneca Rotary 1982-1983. He served as Vice President and member of the Board of Directors 1983-1984.

Appointed Chairman of Extension Committee to establish an additional Rotary Club, the Golden Corner, in Seneca in 1993 which continues to prosper and grow doing community services and meeting weekly. He was presented the G.W. Ballenger award for business proficiency in 1990.

Served as a member/officer and on the Board of Directors of Seneca Jaycees; served as Chairman/ member of different committees, including sponsorship of Seneca Jaycees; chosen outstanding Young Man of the Year" in 1964 in

recognition of activities and services in the community. He served as Chairman of Oconee County Cancer fund during the 1960's; belonged to Seneca Chamber of Commerce and was elected to Board of Directors. Elected to Seneca Chamber of Commerce President and served 1967-1968. Was presented a plaque for outstanding service by the chamber.

A longtime member of St. Mark Methodist Church in Seneca and the Carol Barner Sunday School Class, having served on church finance committee and President of Carol Barner Class and Timothy Sunday School Class. His wife and himself were directors of the church's Methodist Youth Fellowship at St. Mark's circa 1970's.

Appointed officer in charge of Seneca South Carolina National Bank offices in 1980. He was responsible for main office in downtown Seneca and the branch office on Hwy. 123 By-Pass. He immediately began working on an office for Keowee Key and surrounding areas. Property was purchased and plans were made to construct the office at the intersection of Highways 83 and 130. Next, he began work on building a new main office in downtown Seneca on the property where the Oconee Inn and The Palmetto Inn were formerly located to keep the new main office in downtown Seneca rather than relocate. The modern main office opened at Main and Depot Street in 1985 and he continued supervising offices until he retired in 1991. Mr. and Mrs. Ramey were long time members of the Oconee County Assembly

Mr. Ramey served in the United States Army, stationed at Fort Gordon, during the Korean War. He was a 1947 Graduate of Parker High School in Greenville, a member of the Marching Band, and a graduate of LSU School of Banking in 1967, he also attended Oklahoma State University School of Banking in 1980.

Mr. Ramey is survived by daughters, Deborah Ramey Jennings (Robert) of

Catawba, SC, and Beth Ramey Keaton (Rickey) of Walhalla, SC; and grandchildren: Paul Jennings; Christoffer, Ryan, and Samantha Nine; Ben, and Chelsea Keaton.

A funeral service will take place at 11:00 AM on Wednesday, November 21, 2012 at St. Mark United Methodist Church; burial will follow at Oconee Memorial Park.

The family will receive friends on Tuesday, November 20, 2012 from 6:00-8:00 PM at Davenport Funeral Home, Walhalla, SC, and at other times will be at the residence.
