William Lee Schrader, 95 husband of Alice Schrader, of 11 Captain Lane, Salem died Friday, April 19, 2013 at his residence.

A native of Escanaba, Michigan, Mr. Schrader was the son of the late Lewis C. and Anna McEncroe Schrader. Mr. Schrader was a World War II veteran of the United States Army having served in World War II. He was a retired engineer with the U.S. Army Tank Command. Mr. Schrader was a member of St. Paul the Apostle Catholic Church, where he was a member of the Choir of St. Paul. Also, Mr. Schrader was a member of the Keowee Key Koraliers and the Barbershop Chorus.

In addition to his wife, Mr. Schrader is survived by sons, William Schrader of Kalamazoo, MI; James Schrader of Grayslake, IL; David Schrader of Dallas, TX; a daughter, Alice Xenakis of Troy, MI; ten grandchildren, three great-grandchildren.
